CAPHE is a partnership between academic, community organizations, advocates, and governmental organizations. We have been working together since 2013 to develop and implement a Public Health Action Plan to reduce air pollutants and improve health in Detroit.

What is CAPHE's Goal?

Our goal is to work together to identify and implement solutions to Detroit's air quality challenges, and to amplify the voice of Detroit residents in the process.

CAPHE's Public Health Action Plan

CAPHE's scientifically based, community informed Public Health Action Plan (PHAP) was developed through dialogue between the CAPHE partnership and with Detroit residents and leaders.

It includes recommendations for action in 10 key areas to reduce air pollution and improve related health outcomes in Detroit.

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Advancing Air Quality and Health

CAPHE's "Advancing Air Quality and Health" initiative focuses on selected recommendations from the Public Health Action Plan.

Our current priorities include:

1. Expand air quality monitoring in Detroit to increase residents' access to information about air pollution from diesel trucks.
2. Place indoor air filters in Detroit schools and other child-serving organizations where the risk of exposure to air pollutants is high.
3. Share relevant science with local decision makers and community to inform local and state decisions about air quality and health.
4. Evaluate our work to examine and improve our partnership and its impact on air quality and health equity in Detroit.
